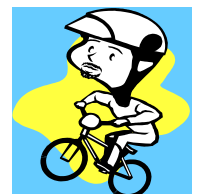
Our Children's Safety--The importance of Helmets when riding, roller-blading or skateboarding

The weather is HOT, the sky is blue and the kids are enjoying outdoor fun. Many of our children are out rollerblading, skateboarding and riding their bikes. Children's safety is of utmost importance to all of us. Wearing helmets is a fundamental safety issue for all of us and should become as natural as tying your shoe

For bikes, head injuries are the most common fatal injury and numbered greater than 200 children in one year. Over 85% of these children were not wearing helmets. Bicycle deaths are most likely to occur in the summer or fall, and are most likely to happen during dusk. What about skateboards? Each year in the U.S., skateboarding injuries cause about 50,000 visits to emergency departments and again, most hospitalizations involve head injury. How about rollerblades? Wrist injuries are more common than head injuries, but lack of a protective equipment (helmet, wrist, elbow and knee guards) contributes to a higher likelihood of serious injury.

To borrow from a famous athletic shoe company—"just do it!" Our job as parents has gotten a bit easier lately because it has become more accepted to wear a helmet. The challenge is consistency and example. Helmets go hand in hand with bikes, scooters, blades, and skateboards. Last year, when my kids bought their out of shape dad a bike for his birthday, they picked out a cool helmet for me too. They have gotten the message, and now they remind me to wear it. But remember, helmets must fit properly. Too small and they don't protect well, too big and they can slide down and actually impair vision and cause injury. Look for a helmet from a national manufacturer. Bring your child with you to the store and try on the helmet. Have them pick out the most appealing color and style that they like. Just make it fun to wear the helmet. The cost of a helmet is reasonable. The average cost of helmets is \$20.00. If that is still too expensive, there are many programs available for obtaining lower cost helmets. Visit the bicycle helmet safety institute at www.bhsi.org for details on low cost helmet programs around the country. The bottom line here is helmets work, cost very little and can make a world of difference in the health of your child this spring and summer.
